

**Registration Notice No. 24, May 2009  
to Queensland Registered Training Organisations**

**Purpose: To advise of issues surrounding units within the TLI07 Transport and Logistics Training Package (Version 2) that stipulates the use of mandated assessment instruments.**

The TLI07 Transport and Logistics Training Package (Version 2) was recently published (end of March 2009). The revised training package includes 12 units of competency that are based on the requirements of the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work. The units are easily identified in the Transport and Logistics Training Package with the code beginning TLILIC. They are to be used for training and assessing for licensing purposes, whereas, current industry units are to be used for assessing workplace competence, which occurs following employment and experience on the job.

The units in their published form meet state and territory licensing requirements. Any alteration will result in units which are not acceptable to regulators for the purpose of licensing. You cannot deliver any of these units either as part of a qualification, as part of skill set or as a stand alone unit without applying to the Registering Body for approval to do so.

State/Territory OHS regulators have mandated the use of assessment instruments and instructions for assessment endorsed by the national body responsible for OHS matters for the assessment of this unit. It is a requirement of each of these units that the assessment be conducted using the **national OHS endorsed assessment instruments**.

However, these instruments **have not yet been developed**. The expected date of release is not known at this stage. Once released, the mandated assessment instruments will only be made available, through Workplace Health and Safety Queensland, to registered training organisations with these units on their scope of registration.

### **What does this mean to me?**

#### I already have some or all of these accredited course units on my scope of registration

You should **continue to enrol students into, and deliver**, the accredited course units for the purpose of giving competent students access to a licensing outcome. The accreditation period of the affected accredited courses will be extended until 1 July 2010 (unless the assessment instruments are available before this date).

#### I don't have the accredited course units on my scope of registration but want to deliver them

Ordinarily, training providers would not be permitted to apply to add superseded units/qualifications or accredited courses to their scope of registration. However, as the training package units cannot yet be delivered, you should **apply to extend your scope of registration to include the desired unit/s from the relevant accredited course/s**. The accreditation period of the affected courses will be extended until 1 July 2010 (unless the assessment instruments are available before this date).

#### Can I apply to add some or all of the new units from the TLI07 training package to my scope of registration?

Yes. You may like to consider the benefits to your business in applying in the near future so that your application can be determined and you can commence delivery as soon as convenient after the release of the mandated assessment instruments. However, should your application be approved, a **condition will be placed on your registration** prohibiting you from delivering any of the units listed above until Workplace Health and Safety Queensland advise us that you have been provided with the mandated assessment instruments. Following this advice, the condition will be lifted and you will be free to deliver the units you have scope to deliver. You will be advised when this has been done.

#### I have applied for some or all of these TLI07 licensing units and have been advised that an audit will be conducted to assess my application

**You should discuss the audit process with your auditor.** However, AQTF Element 1.5 (relating to assessment instruments) will not be audited in respect of these units. You will, however, need to demonstrate compliance with other AQTF elements examined as part of the audit, such as trainers/assessors and equipment and resources required to deliver the units you have applied for.

#### I am registered to deliver TLI07 qualifications. Can I allow students to enrol in these licensing units as electives of a qualification?

No. **You should not enrol students** in a program of study that includes the completion of any of these licensing units as electives until you have these units on your scope of registration and you receive the mandated assessment instruments from Workplace Health and Safety Queensland. Otherwise it would mean that students would not be able to complete the qualification.
